



He served on its four-masted sailing vessels in the Mediterranean, Caribbean, New Zealand, Costa Rica and the South Pacific islands of Tahiti. Recently he transferred to Holland America Line. 





FROM THE TRAVEL GUIDE

It's difficult to be unhappy in Aruba, an island that has only recently emerged as a major tourist destination and has thus preserved a rich and colorful history. To understand the complexity of this island, take a look at the colors of the national flag. The red star in the corner represents the ancient industry of Brazilwood, brought back to Europe by the first the first explorers. The yellow stripes represents the islands economic history in gold mining. The white outlining the star symbolizes the snow-white beaches that now attract tourists from all over the world, as well as the purity of the Aruban people. Surrounding these symbols, is the color blue which represents the ocean and sky that surrounds the island. The star itself has 4 points, said to invite visitors from all corners of the world. All in all Aruba is "One Happy Island" acting as a Caribbean theme park with abundant beaches, scuba diving sites, and incredible vistas. Approximately 1/ 5th of the island is composed of Arikok National Wildlife Park, which is comprised of the three primary geological formations that shape this amazing island: basaltic lava, granite and ancient reef rock. It is this geological composition that creates the alien

landscape of twisted divi-divi trees and cacti found here. Furthermore, it influences the historic human settlement and activity patterns of the island. This area was designated as a national park in the 1980s and is the keystone of the government's long-term ecotourism plan to preserve Aruba's resources and showcases the island's fascinating history.



The first thing that you will notice about Willemstad is the pastel skyline created by the painted Dutch architecture that lines the waterfront. Locals say that it was the 19th century Governor-General Albert Kikkert who is responsible for this colorful architecture. Legend has it that he suffered from migraine headaches that he attributed to the harsh reflection of the sun on the white buildings of Willemstad. Thus a decree was issued to paint the structures any color other the white. Buildings were Caribbean hues of blues, greens, yellows and reds. The result is a vibrant introduction to the city as the ship navigates the slim passage of the Sint Annabaii channel. The city itself is a blend of cultures, from the languages spoken to the cuisine that can be found in this bustling port. Outside of the city, Curacao boasts 38 beaches with reef systems that beacon diving enthusiasts from all over the world. The "C" in the Dutch ABC islands, Curacao is the largest, most populous, and most cosmopolitan of the former Lesser Antilles. Aptly named for the Portuguese word "heart" upon discovery in 1499 this island, rich with culture rooted in history and hospitality, has a good chance of stealing yours during this visit.

By chance of a hurricane damaging his ship, Christopher Columbus was forced to drop anchor near today's Puerto Limon and explore the land while awaiting repairs. He described a place where he had seen "more gold in two days than he had seen in four years in Spain", simply calling it "The Rich Coast". After the return from his voyage he asked the Spanish Crown to sanction him as the governor of Costa Rica, but instead the seat was given to a rival who after several failed expeditions declared the place to be "the poorest and most miserable in all the Americas", a starkly different description. It was only after Costa Rica fought and won its Independence from Spain in 1821 that its true riches were revealed - land fertile for growing coffee. Eventually becoming the country's largest income generator, Puerto Limon would become the main port for the exporting of coffee, making the country the wealthiest in the region. More recently tourism has become the number one export beating both bananas and coffee combined. Leaps and bounds are being made to preserve Costa Rica's natural habitat as "ecotourism" is slowly becoming the driving force for most visitors. Currently rated as the "greenest" country in the world, Costa Rica has announced its plans to become 100% carbon neutral by the year 2030 and is well on its way. Try the local specialty of cashew wine, take a zip-line tour, ride horseback along the beach, cuddle up with some sloths, and let loose in all that nature has to offer. Discover a different type of wealth in this magical place as many have before, and maybe you'll find a new meaning for gold on the Rich Coast.
