FROM YOUR LOCATION TEAM

At only 37 square miles St. Martin/Sint Maarten is the smallest land mass in the world divided between two governments. Having been abandoned by the Spanish in the mid 17th century, the French and Dutch moved onto the island at relatively the same time and, after some conflict, decided to split the island in two. While some historians may disagree, legend has it the border was originally decided by a drunken wager between a Dutchman and a Frenchman. Each agreed to see who could claim the most land by walking in opposite directions around the shore of the island and meeting on the other side. The winner, by a small amount was the Frenchman and still is to this day as the French now govern 21 square miles to the Dutch's 16. Despite the French owning more land, it was the Dutch who came out ahead economically by creating the first duty free port on the island. Philipsburg, the capitol and main port of the Dutch Sint Maarten, is unique in that it is only four streets wide and a mile long but manages to captivate most of the islands visitors. Established in 1763 the small capitol soon became an international trade center and created a bargain hunter's dream where shop after shop competes to give the best products at the lowest price. Anything can be

found on this mile stretch from alcohol to fine jewelry. If you're up for a bit of the local flavor, be sure to try some guavaberry liquor, a fruit exclusive to the island.



The city has been rebuilt several times after suffering devastation from three substantial fires in 1796, 1813, and 1948. Today, Castries boasts a booming tourism industry, attracting thousands of visitors from around the world. Head to Derek Walcott Square and roam this popular area where the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception and the Castries Central Library are located. Spend some time in downtown Castries perusing the duty-free shops. Pick up a souvenir or grab something to take home for yourself at one of many stores in the mall. Continue your shopping excursion at Castries Market where you'll find locally crafted goods and Caribbean spices. Take the kids to Our Planet, where interactive exhibits allow visitors to see the affects of growing worldwide environmental concerns. Head over to the military cemetery, Morne Fortune, to learn about the conflicts between the French and the British while enjoying a picturesqueview of the landscape and seascape below. Wrap up your adventure with some relaxation time just enjoying Marigot Bay. Whether you're on the beach or in a palm-tree sheltered cove, this is an experience you'll remember for a lifetime.





Discover the epitome of paradise on the island of Barbados. Just east of St. Vincent and St. Lucia lies this 166- squaremile (431 square km) island lined with white-sand beaches, lush greenery and plenty of space for enjoying some rest and relaxation. While the island was first discovered in the late 15th century by the Spanish, it was the British who took ownership almost 200 years later in the early 17th century. Barbados has earned itself a strong economy from its robust sugar cane industry and booming tourist draw. Upon arrival, head to the island's largest city, Bridgetown, where you'll find the Parliament Building, Independence Square, the Montefiore Fountain and more. Spend some time here and learn about the history of the island while enjoying the shops, wandering the streets and dining on delectable local food. The island's secondlargest city, Speightstown, lies just 12 miles (19 kilometers) north of Bridgetown and offers street side vendors offering local goods and produce. Art lovers can visit the Gallery of Carribbean Art in this town, which features works by several local and Caribbean artists. Make your way to the countryside to the coastal town of Oistins, where the primary activity is fishing and visitors come to kick up their heels. Join the locals for a fish fry each Friday and hear festive music, watch traditional dances and delve into a choice selection of fresh seafood.







Venture to the French island of Martinique and land at Fort-de-France, where picturesque scenery, a rich military history and lasting memories await you. The city was established as a naval base back in the early 17th century and since has been the victim of several enemy attacks. Fort-de-France has also experienced its share of fires and earthquakes, but by the 20th century the city rose in economic importance. Today, Fort-de-France specializes in rum, sugar, canned fruit and cacao exports and attributes tourism to a good part of its economy. Upon arrival, be sure to visit any of the four forts that occupy the area. Fort Saint Louis, Fort Desaix, Fort Tartenson and Fort Gerbault all offer historical insight to the past threats Martinique faced. Visit the Schoelcher Library and admire its unique architecture. Erected in France in the late 19th century, the building was shipped piece by piece to Martinique and stands today as a monument to slavery abolitionist Victor Schoelcher. Wander the city's central park, La Savane, where the famous statue of Napoleon's Empress, Josephine, stands. Delve into the lush greenery of the island at Balata Gardens or the Parc Naturel Regional de la Martinique. Find several varieties of local plants and trees as well as native island critters.

St Thomas has something for just about everyone and is included on most cruise ship itineraries for just this reason. Originally established as a Dutch colony in the 17th century the island's sugar plantations lost profitability after the abolishment of slavery causing labor prices to skyrocket. With sugar plantations no longer able to maintain its workforce the island's economy sank into a sharp decline. Seeing this as an opportunity, the US purchased St Thomas and two other islands in 1917 for a total of \$25 million as part of a defensive strategy during the First World War. While the island never saw battle, the innovations of war gave the island just what it needed to turn the economy around, large ships and airplanes capable of transporting lots of leisure seeking people. Today St Thomas is one of the busiest ports in the Caribbean as the island is capable of, and often does, support influxes of up to 20 thousand visitors a day. This may have something to do with the port being a renown shopping mecca with some of the best jewelry and fine goods available at a steep discount. If the shopping bug has not bit you yet, the island has much more to offer than deals. Try a tram ride to the top of the island's highest peak or visit an underwater coral reef observatory. Numerous marine protected areas are accessible from St. Thomas. The USVI are a haven for excellent swimming, snorkeling and diving. These MAPs feature a wide variety of tropical ecosystems where you can observe many kinds of coral, fish, and migratory birds.
