

THINGS TO SEE

- 1 The Grenada National Museum** Housed in a building of the Fort George complex, with exhibits relating to the history of the island.
- 2 Market Square** Town center filled with vegetable, fruit and spice vendors.
- 3 The Sendall Tunnel** Spans 350 feet and connects to the Market Square.
- 4 Carenage** A walk along the inner harbor provides lovely views of the water and several beachside restaurants.
- 5 Fort George** Built in 1705 by the French, still has many buildings intact and available to tour. 🗺️
- 6 The Underwater Sculptures** Comprised of 65 sculptures anchored to the bottom of the sea just offshore from Moliniere Bay.

7 Christ of the Deep Monument Given to the people of Grenada, who helped save those on board the *Bianca C*, which sank in its harbor.

EAT

- 8 Museum Bistro** Dishes made from fresh, local ingredients.
- 9 BB's Crabback** Great location on the water offering a unique menu.
- 10 Le Papillion Café** Uses locally grown products to create French dishes.
- 11 The Aquarium Restaurant** Great for lunch or dinner but also has a great beach bar.
- 12 Nutmeg** Provides nice views overlooking Carenage and serves roti and Caribbean beers.
- 13 Victory Bar and Restaurant** Serves pizza and more, located in the marina.

14 Creole Shack Buffet-style restaurant serving up local cuisine.

- A Milano Diamond Gallery** Manufacturer of fine diamond and gemstone jewelry.
- B Imperial Jewelers** The name says it all - a family owned business.

Head to the southwest coast of Grenada at the island's inner harbor and find the capital of the island, St. George. The city was founded by the French in the mid-17th century and since has become a major tourist attraction, drawing thousands of visitors every year. Temperatures average in the 80s (Fahrenheit) year-round, which provides a perfect environment for spice production. Upon visiting, be sure to pick up any of the local spices that are offered like cocoa, mace, cloves, vanilla, ginger and cinnamon. If hiking is in your itinerary, take to the trails of Mt. Qua Qua, towering more than 2,300 feet into the sky. Or hike out to St. Margaret's Falls, which offers a picturesque view of the serene island habitat. Catch up on your local history with a visit to Fort George. Erected in the early 18th century, the fort was once used to protect the city from intruders and is now utilized by local police. Spend some time wandering the Grenada National Museum. Built in 1704, the museum once served as a prison and the island's first hotel.

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GET OUT OF TOWN

Grand Anse Beach Grenada's most popular beach, renowned for its white-sand beaches.

Fort Frederick Built in 1779 and used by Grenada's armed forces until the 1980s.

Grand Etang National Park Located in a tropical rain forest with a unique ecosystem full of monkeys, frogs and other interesting flora and fauna. 🌿
