

THINGS TO SEE

- 1 **Museum of Antigua and Barbuda** Provides a historical overview of the island.
- 2 **Fort James** The fort wall still remains of this fort built by the British in 1709.
- 3 **St. John's Cathedral** Elaborate church built on a hill overlooking the city.
- 4 **Fort Barrington** Seventeenth-century fort provides magnificent views of the harbor.
- 5 **Government House** Built in 1750 and served as the house of the British governor of the Leeward Islands.
- 6 **Cenotaph Monument** built in memory of residents who lost their lives in WWI and WWII.
- 7 **Recreation Ground** Once the national stadium for all sporting events, in particular, West Indies Cricket.

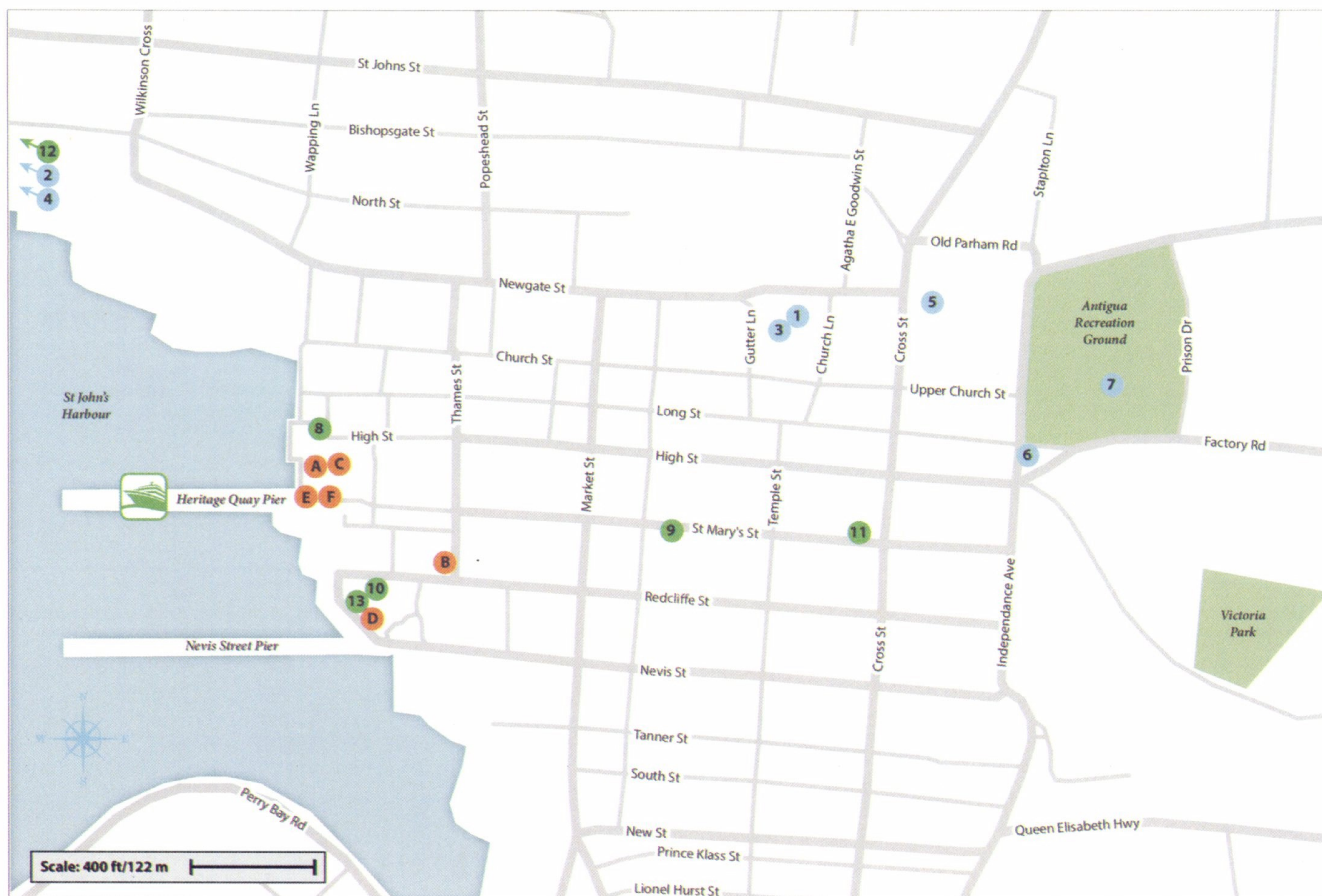
- 8 **Café Bambula** Somewhat hidden in an alley with a garden patio and Mediterranean dishes.

- 10 **Café Napoleon** Small restaurant offers French menu.

- 12 **Miller's by the Sea** Beachside restaurant with extensive menu to please all palettes.

Spend some time in the largest city of Antigua and Barbuda, St. John's. Serving as the country's industrial powerhouse, the city also serves as one of the most developed in the Lesser Antilles. A trip here offers top-of-the-line shopping with boutiques filled with couture clothing, designer jewelry and local fashions. Spend some time at Heritage Quay to satisfy your shopping fancy. Grab a bite at one of several restaurants offering local cuisine before exploring more of the city. Museum lovers have their pick of the Museum of Antigua and Barbuda, the Museum of Marine Art and Harmony Hall. Architecture buffs will relish the chance to see the Baroque towers of St. John's Cathedral — towering over the city skyline. Discover the rich British history of the island with visits to Fort Barrington, looming over the shoreline, or Fort James, which was built to protect the entrance of the harbor. Wander through Betty's Hope, a sugar plantation erected in the late 17th century. Today visitors can learn about island history in the museum, and the monument serves as a remembrance of those who were enslaved. Wander through the botanical garden and enjoy native flora in peaceful surroundings. If visiting on a Saturday, don't miss the Saturday morning market offering local goods.
