#### 1 Museum of Discovery and Science

Interactive museum featuring exhibits on ecology, health and outer space.

**2 Riverwalk** Hailed as "Florida's Most Beautiful Mile" complete with dining, shopping and museums. 🚶

#### 3 Fort Lauderdale Historical Society Museum

Consists of four historic structures with exhibits following the history of the area.

**11 The Floridian** Landmark famous for its breakfasts.

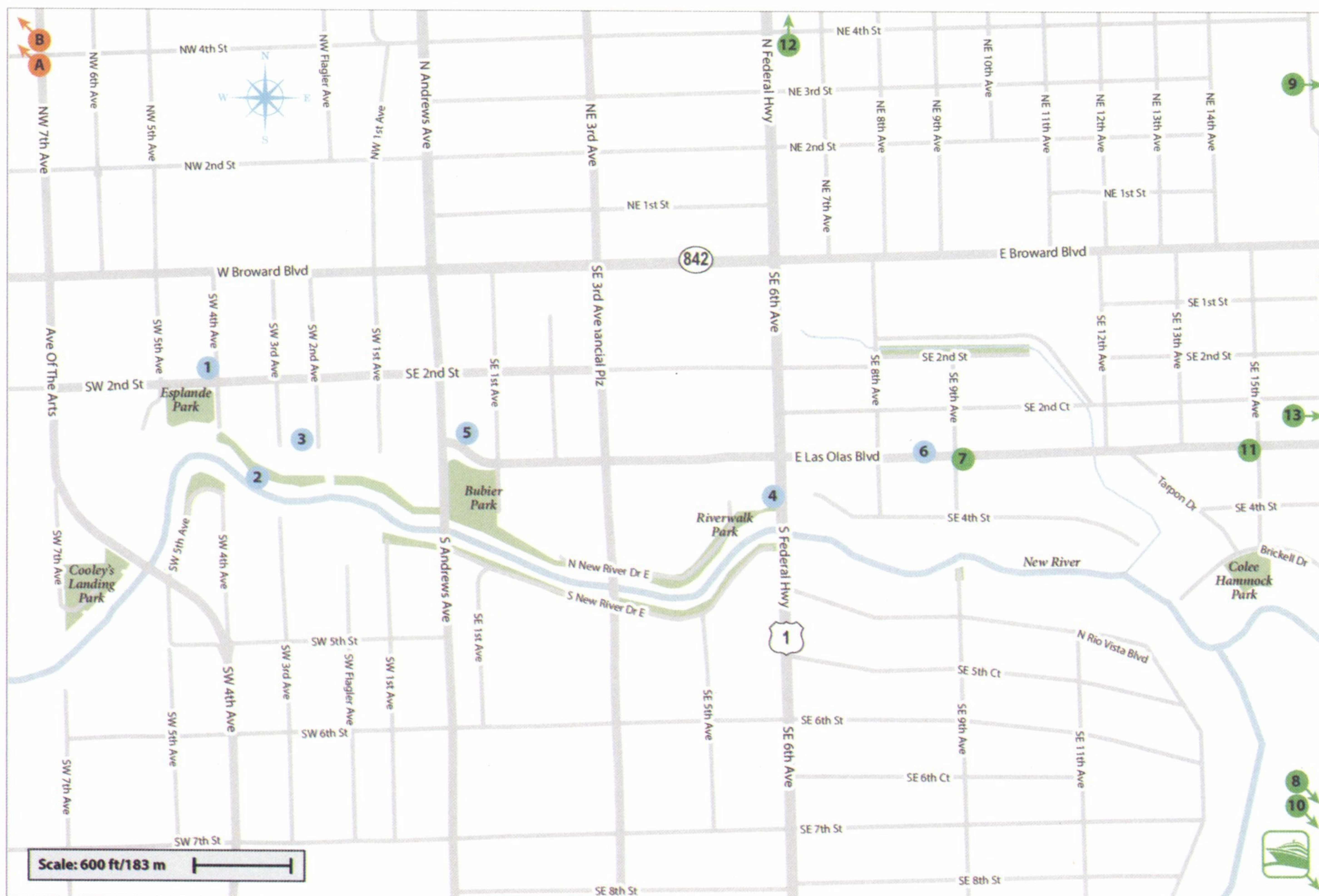
**12 Jalisco** Small, family-owned Mexican restaurant.

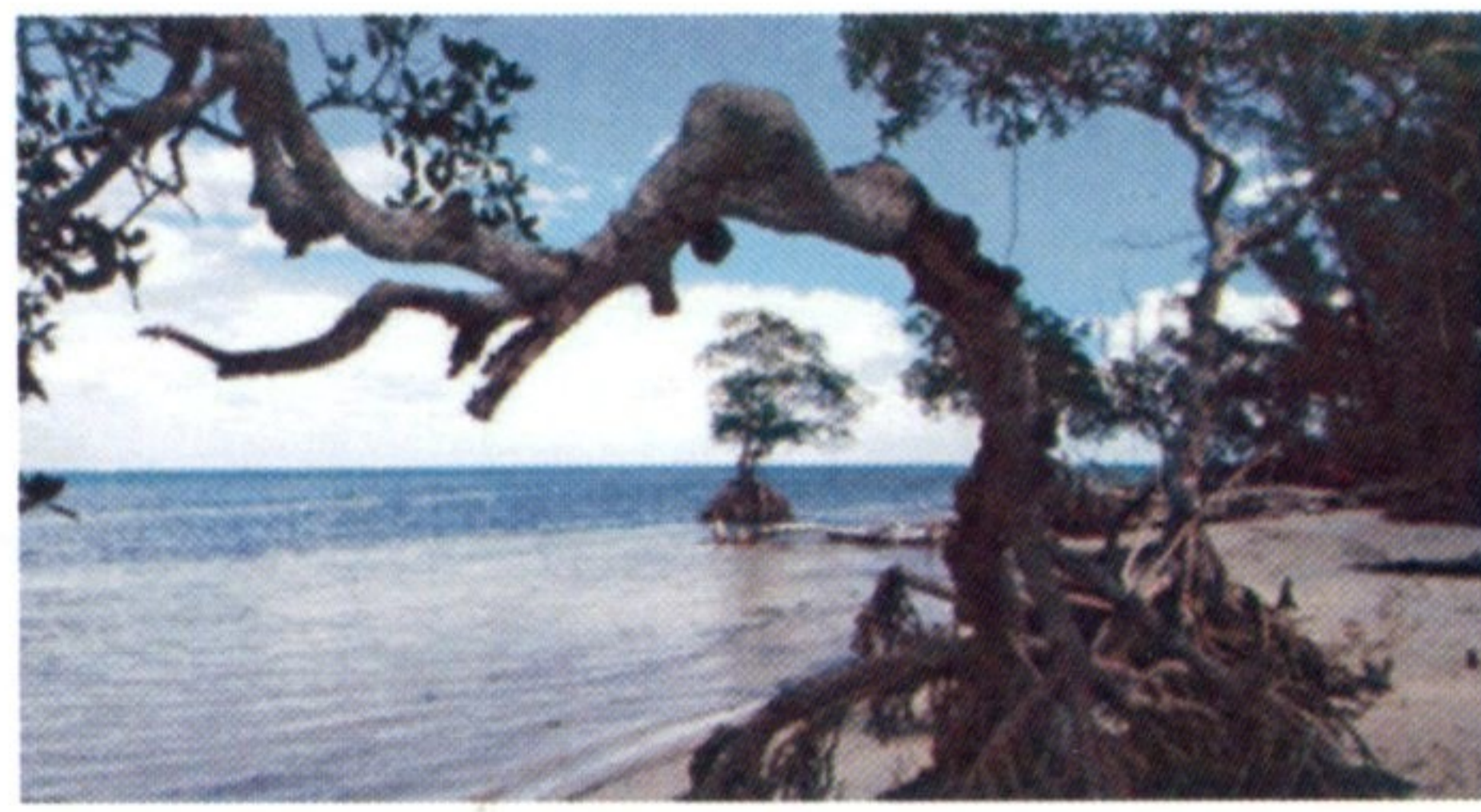
**13 Chima** Excellent Brazilian rodizio.
