





HOT SPRINGS COMMUNITYPROFILE

Climate

At a comfortable 64 degrees, Hot Springs the highest annual average temperature in the state. Our average median temperature, averaging highs and lows, is 48.5 degrees. An average year will



see 17.5 inches of rain and nearly 27 inches of snow. During the winter, the prevailing wind comes from the northwest, but switches in the summer to the southwest. We are at 3,535 feet above sea level.

Community Facilities

Hot Springs is home to 22 churches, 17 motels with approx. 450 rooms, 4 Bed & Breakfast Inns, 6 Banquet Rooms, 5 Caterers, 11 Meeting Rooms, and 1 Entertainment Convention Center. The Mueller Civic Center has seating capacities of 403 in the Theater, 1,250 in the Auditorium, 80 in the Conference Room, and 150 in the Annex.

Transportation

HIGHWAY – Hot Springs is served by State Highways 385 and 18 and also Highway 71 to the south. The Highway 79 junction is located 5 miles away, and gives four-lane divided access to Rapid City and Interstate 90, 55 miles to the north.

RAIL – Rail companies are also prevalent in the area with the Burlington Northern-Santa Fe coming through Edgemont, 27 miles to the west. The Dakota, Minnesota and Eastern railroad operates on the east side of Fall River County, 10 miles away.

AIR - Rapid City Regional Airport is 62 miles away and offers the nearest commercial air service. Chadron, Neb., the same distance to the south also has direct flights in and out to Denver. The Hot Springs Municipal Airport is located 6 miles southeast of Hot Springs and has a hard surface with 4,500 feet of runway, including 2 runways with one instrument approach. Government

The city of Hot Springs has a Mayor, City Administrator, and eight City Council members, representing four wards. Each term is two-years. Fall River County has a Board of five atlarge Commissioners, each of whom are elected to a four-year term. The City Police Force has seven full-time and two reserve officers and the Hot Springs Fire Department is entirely made up of a dedicated group of approximately 40 volunteers. Hot Springs carries a Class 5 fire insurance rating and has a city zoning ordinance in effect.

Housing

There were a total of 2,060 units, with a median housing value of \$108,100. (US Census Bureau)

Population

There are approximately 3,460 people living in Hot Springs and 6,867 in Fall River County. (US Census Bureau, 2017 estimates)

Labor Force

As of February 2019, the unemployment rate in all of Fall River County was at 4.6 percent with a workforce of 2,947 (SD Dept. of Labor). The male median income for Hot Springs is \$35,219 with the female median income \$26,052 (US Census Bureau).

Health

The VA Medical Center has 130 beds and offers care to America's veterans. Fall River Hospital currently offers 25 beds in its critical care hospital. For care facilities Seven Sisters Living Center offers 48 beds with an expansion underway in 2019, the Michael J. Fitzmaurice State Veterans Home has 100 beds for veterans and spouses and the Pine Hills Retirement Community has 61 units. Hot Springs boasts two family medical clinics, two chiropractic clinics, a pair of dental offices, two physical therapy clinics, an eye clinic and a health-food store.

Communication

- The Fall River County Herald newspaper is available each Thursday, and serves all the towns of the county, including Hot Springs, Edgemont, Oelrichs, Oral, and Smithwick. The Hot Springs Star newspaper is also published every Wednesday. The region's daily newspaper is the Rapid City Journal.
- Hot Springs has two radio stations in KZMX (96.7 FM and 580 AM) and KJFP (92.7 FM).
- Golden West Telecommunications handles the cable television needs of the area.
- The Hot Springs Post Office (zip code 57747) is downtown and offers a drive-up mailbox.
- The Hot Springs Public Library has more than 20,000 volumes and carries more than 90 magazines, 2,000 DVDs, 750 Audio books, offers wireless access throughout the building and patio. Hours M, Th, F 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Tu-Wed 11:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., Sat 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Recreation

Hot Springs boasts five city parks which contain four ballfields, (baseball, soccer and softball), two tennis courts, a basketball court and a skateboard park. In addition, there is a challenging 18-hole golf course, a bowling alley, a miniature golf course, an indoor swimming pool (Evans Plunge), miles of walking trails, and 44 active clubs and organizations.

Education

The Hot Springs Public Schools offer classes at the Elementary (Pre-K - 5th), Middle School (Grades 6-8) and High School levels (Grades 9-12). Total enrollment for the 2018-19 school year is 763 students with 338 in elementary, 177 in middle school and 248 in high school. There are 65 certified teachers district-wide. See www.hssd.k12.sd.us for more info.

Private schools include Bethesda Lutheran (Pre-2nd) with 2 teachers and 20 students.

For higher education, Hot Springs has Cornerstone Bible Institute, which was founded in 1993 and trains students for ministry.

The Boy & Girls Club of Hot Springs (745-8000) is open year-round five-days-a-week and offers an after-school program.

Events that you don't want to miss!

Not only is Hot Springs home to some of the best attractions in all of the Black Hills, but it also hosts some of the finest events – some which have withstood the test of time for many years, and a few others that have begun in just the past few years.

Following are descriptions of the area's most popular categorized summer events. For a full list of happenings, turn the page for the 2019 Events Calendar.

SIGNATURE EVENTS

WINE WALK & PUTT WEEKEND (MAY 24):

A kick-off event for Hot Springs' downtown businesses, set for Friday night, May 24, this a wildly popular Friday night that features several local shops hosting wine and beer tasting, fun and unique miniature golf putt-putt holes and other games, along with snacks and other refreshments. In addition, other special sales and events will happen throughout the weekend to include "Stars, Stripes & Steps" downtown stair climb and Centennial Park fun & games.

MAIN STREET ARTS & CRAFTS FESTIVAL (JUNE 21-23):

Dozens of craft, art and food vendors will fill Centennial Park in downtown Hot Springs, for the 43rd consecutive year on Friday - Sunday, June 21-23. Live music is also performed all three days.

FALL RIVER FOURTH (JULY 3-4)

A downtown street dance on Wednesday, July 3, begins the two-day slate of events, followed by running races, a downtown parade, community picnic and Firequacker Duck Race in Fall River - all leading up to the evening fireworks display! All of this provides a full day of events to keep both residents and visitors having a "blast" all day long! As South Dakota's official "Veterans Town," there's no better place in the state to celebrate our country's independence!

FALL RIVER HOT AIR BALLOON FESTIVAL (AUG. 24-25)

This 4th annual event is quickly on its way to becoming THE event for Hot Springs, as its expected to draw up to 25-30 hot air balloons this year from around the country for two days of early morning launches and an evening Night Glow, all from the Hot Springs Municipal Airport. WILDCAT CLASSIC MOUNTAIN BIKE RACE (AUG. 17)

This year's 4th annual event on Saturday, Aug. 17, features 40 miles of mountain biking, beginning in Chautauqua Park on the northern edge of Hot Springs with an elevation of 3,500 feet, and then proceeding north through the Black Hills National Forest with a high point of 4,930 feet, also hugging the borders of Wind Cave National Park. Three distances are offered, including the 40 mile classic, 28 mile quickie and a 7 mile kiddy/ beginner.

Riders can expect 22.5 miles of singletrack, plus an additional 9 miles of singletrack equipped with passing lanes. Gravel grinders will appreciate the 6 miles of gravel travel and 2.5 miles totally paved, getting in and out of town. Canyon bottoms and rims, meadows, ridge tops, downhills, and gradual climbs create the course. For more info, go to www.wildcatclassic.com.

SOUTHERN HILLS TRIATHLON

(AUG. 31): Held at Angostura Recreation Area, just south of Hot Springs, the event will celebrate its 22nd year this Labor Day weekend, Aug. 31, 2019.



The Youth Triathlon is one of the races involved with the annual Southern Hills Triathlon held each Labor Day Weekend at Angostura Recreation Area.

It features an Olympic Triathlon (1 mile swim, 25 mile bike, 6 mile run), Sprint Triathlon (.5 mile swim, 12 mile bike, 3 mile run), a Duathlon (3 mile run, 12 mile bike, 3 mile run) and Kids Triathlon (100 yard swim, 4 mile bike, 1 mile run). For more info, go to www.HotSpringsLibraryFriends.org.

CLIMB HOT SPRINGS (SEPT. 21)

Also celebrating its 4th year is the annual "Climb Hot Springs" which is a unique walker friendly outdoor stair-climb race. The

full course will cover seven miles and 657 challenging steps, up five historic stairways in downtown Hot Springs.

While on the race, experience breathtaking views as you run, walk or stroll through the heart of town, past Victorian homes and unique sandstone buildings, up the historic Battle Mountain Grand Staircase to the Hot Springs VAMC and past the waterfall on the Freedom Trail. TOUR #1 Connecting . POINTS

• BLACK HILLS WILD HORSE SANCTUARY is home to over 400 wild mustangs in a natural western habitat and a working ranch. Visit Hollywood movie sets, see Native American ceremonial sites and ancient petroglyphs. Visit the gift shop and Wild Horse Café! Tours of varying lengths are available

by appointment only.

• CASCADE SPRINGS & KEITH PARK is located roughly 7.5 Miles south of Hot Springs on Hwy 71, Cascade Springs is where you can experience one of the warm water springs bubbling up underneath the historic gazebo. Picnic area also.

- CASCADE FALLS SWIMMING & PICNIC AREA is located 9.5 miles south of Hot Springs on Hwy 71, Cascade Falls is a US Forest Service operated picnic and swimming area. Spring-fed from water originating at Cascade Springs.
- EVANS PLUNGE is the Black Hills' oldest attraction, a natural warm mineral water pool built over several warm water springs. Water slides and games, hot tubs, health club and gift shop.
- KIDNEY SPRINGS offers the opportunity to drink from a natural warm mineral spring under the wooden gazebo. Water is safe to drink. Stand in the conductor's spot in the bandshell nearby and say something aloud for a surprise!

Black Hills Wild Horse Sanctuary: 2-3 Hours

The Black Hills Wild Horse Sanctuary, a preserve for both wild horses and prairie lands located south of Hot Springs on Highway 71, is the perfect spot to reconnect with the world as it once was. Take a guided tour and not only get up close and personal with wild mustangs but also explore Native American historic and cultural sites.

Cascade Falls/Keith Park: ½ Hour

On your way back into town, be sure to stop at Cascade Falls, the local "swimming hole." The water is cooler than in town, but still refreshing, and in a beautiful natural environment to boot!

Stop for Lunch at Southern Hills Diner

Located just off the corner of Highway 71 and Sheps Canyon Road about 6 miles out, Southern Hills Diner's full-service farm-to-table food experience dishes up great-tasting locally-sourced meals raised naturally, free from chemicals and pesticides.

Kidney Springs: ½ Hour

Bring a reusable water bottle (you can purchase special ones at the Visitor Center in the old train depot!) – Kidney Springs' crisp, clear warm mineral spring water has been sampled by thousands over the years and we invite you to taste it yourself.

Art Galleries: 1-2 Hours

Hot Springs is proud to be the home of a number of fine art galleries with expansive and eclectic collections to view – and maybe even take home with you! Visit at your own pace, the Morris Grand Gallery, Blue Horn Gallery, and Chautauqua Artisans Market, all located in downtown Hot Springs!





The Black Hills Wild Horse Sanctuary is located just 14 miles south of Hot Springs.



Many Breakfast Options:

Whether you're looking for something quick to grab or a full sit-down breakfast, many choices are available. Sit-down options include The Vault, Daily Bread, Jitterbug Junction and Mornin' Sunshine – all downtown. Grab-and-go options include doughnuts at Lynn's Dakotamart or the breakfast menu at Subway or Taco John's.

Downtown Hot Springs: 1/2 Hour

Gear up with all the supplies you'll need for the day with maps, apparel, bike or kayak rentals and more from High Mountain Outfitters. Hot Springs ACE Hardware is the place to purchase a South Dakota fishing license, and has a great sporting goods section (specializing in fishing & camping) to boot!

Wind Cave National Park

- Rankin Ridge Nature Trail: 1 Hour

Wind Cave's depths aren't the only thing worth seeing in the park. Above ground, there are three self-guided trails and over 30 miles of hiking trails for you to explore. For most visitors, we would highly recommend the approx. 1 mile, moderately strenuous loop on Rankin Ridge Trail. Rankin Ridge Trail offers 14 interpretive sites including sweeping prairie views, amazing panoramas and more from the top of the Ridge! You can pick up a nature trail brochure to learn about the habitats, flora and fauna of the area. Watch for snakes & bison!

Trout Haven Ranch: 1-2 Hours

On your way back from Wind Cave, pop across on 7-11 Road to Trout Haven Ranch. Trout Haven raises over 1 million trout each year for stocking in ponds and streams across the United States and Canada. Everything – pole, bait, string, gear – is

furnished and you're guaranteed some great catches, no license required! Make sure to bring some extra cash – your fish can be cleaned and packaged or grilled on site.

Picnic Lunch at a City Park: 1 Hour

Stop at Sonny's Super Foods, Lynn's Dakotamart, or ShopKo Hometown to stock up on groceries for a picnic lunch at one of Hot Springs' stunning city parks. The largest, Butler Park, located near the Hot Springs Public Library, not only has picnic tables & charcoal grills, but a playground, walking trails, tennis courts, soccer and baseball fields. Chautaugua Park, a hidden gem located just north of Evans Plunge Mineral Springs, has a small playground and charcoal grills but is most known for its stone bridge from which you can sit and dip your feet into Fall River's warm waters. Brookside Park, just off the downtown, offers a playground, and access to the river and the Fall River Freedom Trail.

TOUR #2 Connecting POINTS

- ANGOSTURA RESERVOIR & RECREATION AREA is a state operated recreation area that offers boating, fishing, swimming, camping, trail riding, hiking and more!
- BATTLE MOUNTAIN DRIVE Take a drive up Skyline Drive and view three states from atop Battle Mountain, overlooking beautiful Hot Springs. High clearance vehicles only. No RVs. Not an all-weather road.
- COLD BROOK LAKE & RECREATION AREA is north of Evans Plunge. Swimming, fishing, camping, playground, basketball and hiking at a beautiful manmade lake operated by US Army Corps of Engineers.
- COTTONWOOD LAKE & RECREATION AREA is located approximately 5 miles west of Hot Springs on Hwy 18. Swimming, fishing, camping, picnicking, biking and hiking. Operated by US Army Corps of Engineers.

- SOUTHERN HILLS GOLF COURSE is an award-winning, challenging, 18-hole municipal golf course. One of the most beautiful courses in South Dakota. Book a tee time online!
- TROUT HAVEN RANCH is located northeast of Hot Springs. Fish for Rainbow Trout (no license required!) and see how trout are raised to supply restaurants, lakes & streams across the country.
- WIND CAVE NATIONAL PARK features above ground, wildlife like buffalo, prairie dogs, pronghorn, deer, coyotes and more roam free on the preserved American prairie landscape. Underground, explore Wind Cave, the sixth longest cave in the world, known for its "boxwork" formations. Camping and hiking available.

Take Your Pick, Golfing or Lakeside Fun: 2-4 Hours

• Southern Hills Golf Course: 2-4 Hours

Set aside an afternoon to golf at the Southern Hills Golf Course, just off Hwy 18 heading west out of town. This spectacular 18-hole course with beautiful views of the Southern Hills was rated 4.5 stars by Golf Digest and is frequently recognized as one of the best places to play in South Dakota. Be sure to call ahead for a tee time. Didn't bring your clubs? The clubhouse rents out clubs!

• Angostura Recreation Area: 2-4 Hours

Set along the crystal clear shores of Angostura Reservoir, this state-run recreation area is a water-lover's haven, with opportunities for boating, fishing, and swimming. But there are also plenty of opportunities for fun on land, with a disc golf course, hiking trails, horseshoes, volleyball and even bicycle rentals to cruise the bike trails along the lake.

Dinner @ Big Time Pizza

A long day full of outdoor activities will leave you with a rumbly tummy! Head downtown to Big Time Pizza. Big Time Pizza is an iconic Black Hills restaurant

with scrumptious pizzas made to order. Their most famous pie is the 20" "Quad," a massive, 16-slice, ¼ cheese, ¼ pepperoni, ¼ all meat and ¼ supreme pizza weighing in at almost 6 lbs. They also offer local craft beer!

Stay overnight at one of Hot Springs' campgrounds!

Whether you stay lakeside at Angostura or Cold Brook or Cottonwood Lakes, or tucked under the pine trees at Allen Ranch or the Hot Springs KOA, or in the shadow of Battle Mountain at Kemo Sabay Campground, you're guaranteed a relaxing night of rest in the great outdoors!

ITINERARY ALTERNATIVES

Battle Mountain Hike: 3-4 Hours

Recommended only for more fit and experienced hikers, this strenuous hike follows a steeply-graded 1.4 mile trail from the base of Battle Mountain (elev. 4,434 ft) up nearly one thousand feet to its summit. Be cautious – the dirt road leading up the hill may be difficult for vehicles, especially after heavy rains or spring runoff. The view of Hot Springs from the top, however, makes it all worthwhile!

Cold Brook or Cottonwood Lakes:

1-2 Hours

Cold Brook and Cottonwood lakes are beautiful, manmade lakes operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Cottonwood, 5 miles west of town on Highway 18, offers opportunities for swimming, fishing, camping, non-electric boating, and picnicking. Cold Brook, located just north of Evans Plunge Mineral Springs, offers similar amenities and activities but also adds in a basketball court, a beach, and a playground!



Tour Option #3RECONNECT WITH HISTORY

Follow in the footsteps of mammoths, spot secret details in beautiful Victorian-era architecture, pay your respects to generations past, and discover whole new worlds.

Breakfast at Daily Bread

Daily Bread Bakery & Café offers up some of the sweetest treats in town with baked goods galore, including breads, muffins, cookies, donuts, rolls and more plus a full breakfast menu to boot!

The Mammoth Site: 2 Hours

Travel back in time and discover the world's largest concentration of mammoth remains in the world at the Mammoth Site. Your Ice Age journey begins with a 10 minute high-definition video that sets the stage for your 30 minute-guided tour. On the tour you will see the in-situ (in the original position or place) bonebed and learn about the discoveries made at the Mammoth Site!

Wind Cave National Park Cave Tour: 2 Hours

The most popular cave tour at Wind Cave National Park is the moderately strenuous, 2/3 mile Natural Entrance Cave Tour, entering through a manmade entrance and journeying through the middle level of the cave. Wind Cave's famous boxwork formations are abundant on this tour. We highly recommend this tour and a visit to their free on-site museum. Make sure to call in advance for availability!

Lunch at Dew Drop Inn Café or Sancho's Bar & Grill: 1 Hour

On your way back to town from Wind Cave National Park on Highway 385, try Dew Drop Inn, a retro café right alongside the highway, or Sancho's Bar & Grill, downtown next to the Hot Springs Theatre. Dew Drop Inn's classic menu is a throwback to drive-ins, with sandwiches, homecut fries, and sides as well as shakes, sundaes and cones. Sancho's offers up slow-cooked brisket sandwiches, burgers, ribs and chicken meals alongside a menu of Mexican cuisine.

Depot Visitor Center: 1/2 Hour

Start your afternoon journey through Hot Springs' Historic District at the Visitor Information Center, located within the original train depot, once known as the Smallest Union Depot in the world! The Chamber of Commerce's staff are a wealth of information about the community and its remarkable history.

Digital Architecture Tour & Shopping: 1-2 Hours

Enjoy a brisk walk along the Fall River Freedom Trail while checking out our self-guided online architecture tour guide at www.soakinhotsprings.com. Discover hidden architectural secrets, pop into the unique local shops along the Hot Springs downtown, and be sure to stop to drink from Kidney Springs!

TOUR #3 Connecting POINTS

• BATTLE MOUNTAIN SANITARIUM NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK Originally built in 1907 as one of the first National Soldier's Homes, it was the only home that was intended for short term healthcare instead of long term care,

making it the oldest national veterans hospital in America, pre-dating the Dept. of Veterans Affairs, which now operates a hospital, domiciliary, and museum.

- THE MAMMOTH SITE 26,000 year-old bone bed, still being unearthed. Discoveries include over 61 individual mammoths, as well as other prehistoric animals. A must-see educational opportunity for adults and children alike!
- **DEPOT VISITOR'S CENTER** is an original railroad train depot made of sandstone. Find all the information you need on the Hot Springs area or the Black Hills by stopping in! Free Wi-Fi for visitors. Operated by Hot Springs Area Chamber of Commerce through tourist season.

- FALL RIVER FREEDOM TRAIL RIVER WALK Approximately one mile-long paved walking path alongside beautiful Fall River. Start at either Train Depot Visitor's Center or Big Bat's Convenience Store and enjoy Hot Springs the best way on foot!
- HOT SPRINGS PUBLIC LIBRARY Located near Butler Park in a beautiful "ski lodge"-esque building. Hundreds of books & publications for all ages. Historical room full of information collected on Hot Springs & Fall River County. Public computers & Wi-Fi.
- HOT SPRINGS THEATRE recently re-opened under new local ownership, with a brand-new digital projector, sound system and several other upgrades, including a newly painted façade. Movies are shown Friday, Saturday and Sunday at 7 p.m., with 2 p.m. matinees on Saturday and Sunday downtown at 241 N. River Street.
- PIONEER MUSEUM Contains exceptional artifacts and memorabilia documenting history of Southern Black Hills displayed in a historic three-story 1890's schoolhouse overlooking downtown Hot Springs.

Battle Mountain Sanitarium National Historic Landmark: 15 Minutes

Along your tour, make sure to stop at VA Black Hills Health Care System, which is located within the 1907 Battle Mountain Sanitarium National Historic Landmark building atop the hill and visible from almost anywhere in town.

Pioneer Museum: 1-2 Hours

Within the original sandstone school house lies over 125 years of Fall River County History. From exhibits about stonecutting and cowboy lifestyle to frontier doctors and military veterans, the self-guided Pioneer Museum is sure to have something to pique your curiousity.

Dinner at The Hot Springs Vault or China Buffet: 1 Hour

Did you know? The "Central Block" building which houses the Hot Springs Vault was originally a bank? (You'll learn facts like this on the digital tour above!) That's how The Vault – known for its sandwiches and burgers - got its name – the centerpiece of this restaurant & pub is the bank vault located behind the bar! Feeling

more adventurous? China Buffet, just a couple doors down, offers shrimp, pork and chicken selections, rice, soup and egg rolls, all freshly prepared, or a variety of delicious menu items!

Bourbon-County: 1 Hour

Unwind at the end of the day at Bourbon-County Speakeasy. Styled after the speakeasies of the Depression Era, this trendy venue has regular musical performers and events. Staff is primed with factoids about the fascinating history of bourbon, one of the great American distilled spirits.

Stay overnight at one of Hot Springs' hotel accommodations!

ITINERARY ALTERNATIVES

Evergreen Cemetery: 1-2 Hours

Cemeteries tell us as much about a place and the people who have lived there as any museum. Pay your respects to icons of the Southern Black Hills like Fred Evans, the man who oversaw construction of much of Hot Springs' historic downtown, Badger Clark, South Dakota's first poet laureate and famously the author of "A Cowboy's Prayer", and oddities like Dr. Orlando Ferguson, a Flat Earth theorist whose "Square and Stationary Earth" map is an historical curiosity.

Helen McGee Heritage Room at the Public Library: 1-2 Hours

Perfect for family genealogists and those deeply curious about Hot Springs' past, the Helen McGee Heritage Room at the Hot Springs Public Library contains many one-of-a-kind documents, maps, original photos, handwritten historical accounts, artifacts and all issues of the local newspaper on microfilm.

Hot Springs Theatre: 2 Hours

Grab a bag of popcorn and catch a recent release at the historic Hot Springs Theatre. Built in 1929 with Art Deco design elements, this theatre was recently upgraded with a high-definition digital projector and sound system to give you a modern viewing experience – ask the staff about some of the neat structural details of the building

An advanced paleontology program is available for children 10 and

Pioneer Museum: 1-2 Hours

The Pioneer Museum, inside the historic sandstone school house, provides kids a scavenger hunt through its many exhibits. Exhibits of interest include an old time Doctor's Office, a music room, a pioneer market/general store, and, of course, a pioneer classroom.
