




JUNIOR TRI-HI-Y


VOCATIONAL HI-Y



ATTENDANCE STAFF






Band

MR. JEFFERSON is every athlete's friend for he handles athletic equipment for all activities at home games and away.



Winning the W. P. I. A. L. "AA" championship for the second consecutive year, the 1947 Ken Hi football team made participation for a W. P. I. A. L. championship berth something of an annual affair. Considerable tribute should be and has been paid to Coach Fletcher and his assistant coaches, Mr. Gibson Mr. Dunn, Mr. Armstrong, Mr. Jefferson and Mr. Veitch, who successfully guided a team which had been conceded little chance of duplicating the championship season of the previous year. The team, however, not only went undefeated, beating such strong clubs as Beaver Falls, Johnstown, Ambridge, Vandergrift and Sharon, but they also amassed enough points to top the W. P. I. A. L. standing. In a classic playoff at Forbes Field, where they defeated Har-Brack 28-0, the champions silenced once and for all those dissenters who claimed the title for Brownsville or McKeesport. They also extended the Red and Black's unbeaten record to seventeen consecutive games.




