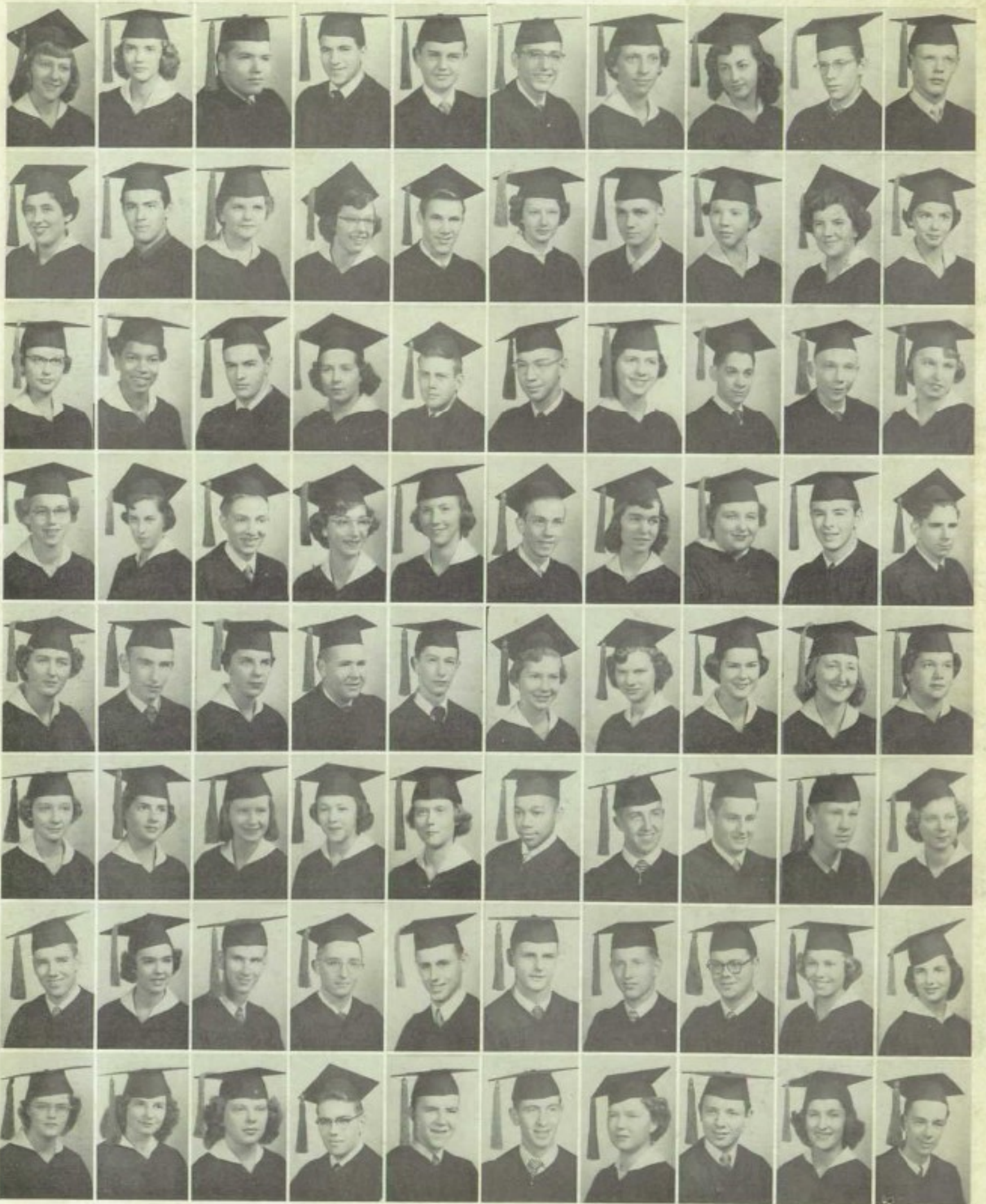

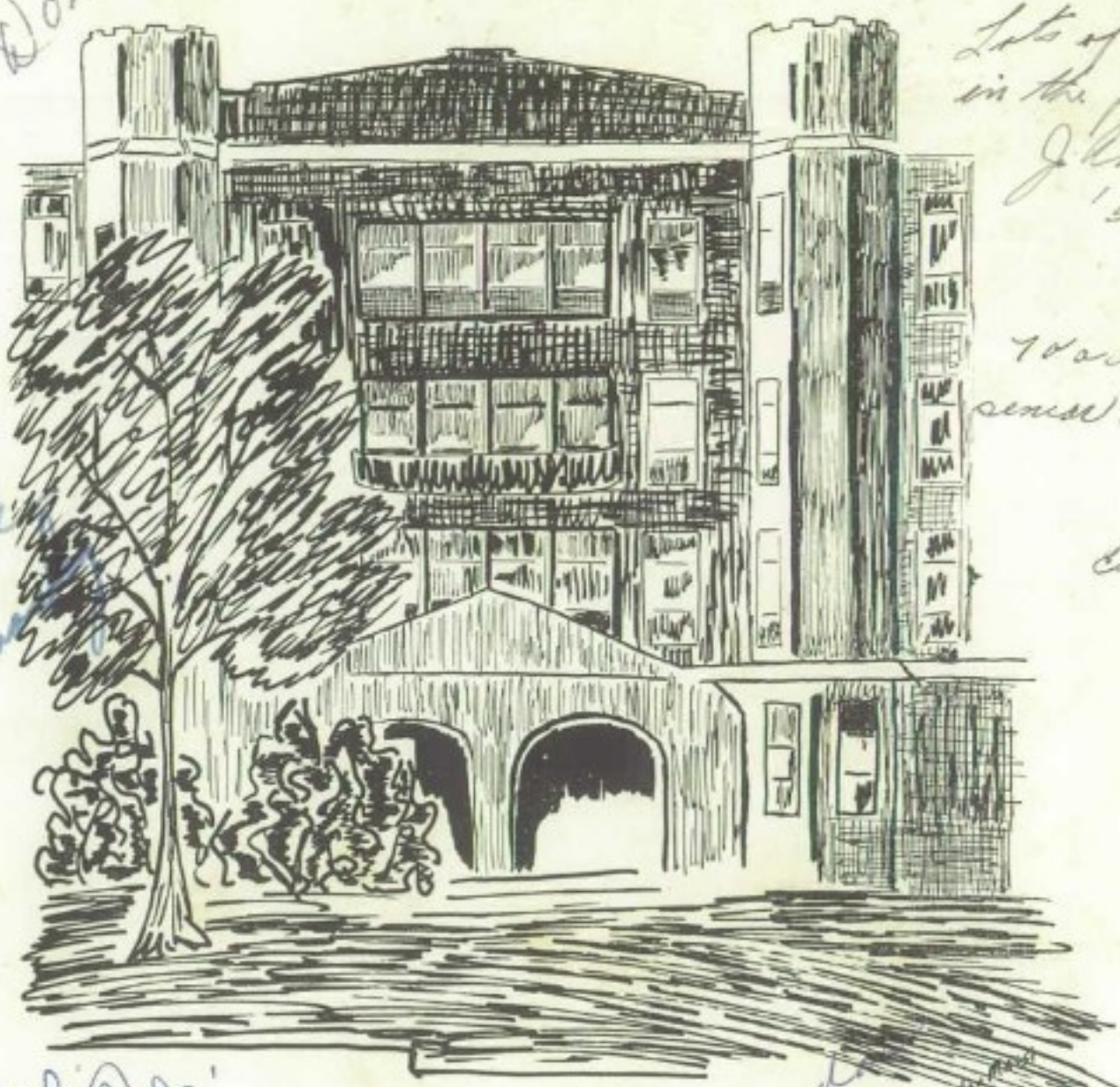

DEDICATION

We, the members of the Class of 1954, and all other students of Ken High, gratefully pay tribute to Dr. E. T. Chapman, who will retire this year from years of unselfish service to the youth of the city of New Kensington. Elected superintendent in 1924, Dr. Chapman has served us for the past thirty years. Only three other superintendents in Pennsylvania have served longer in the same capacity. He first came to New Kensington in 1916. From that year until 1924, he held such positions as principal and teacher at Third Ward School, supervisor of the First, Second (the first New Kensington High School), and Third Ward Schools, and assistant superintendent of the elementary and junior high schools. As a result of Dr. Chapman's capable administrating, Ken Hi has risen to a high standard as evidenced in the high rating given it by the Middle Atlantic States Association of High Schools and Colleges. He is a life member of the National Education Association, and also belongs to the Association of American School Administrators, the Pennsylvania State Education Association, and the Pennsylvania District Superintendents Association. During his years of service, Dr. Chapman has always done what is best for the school. In thanks for this and his continual help and guidance to us, the Class of 1954 dedicates this Taleoer to Dr. E. T. Chapman.

RALPH ARMOUR

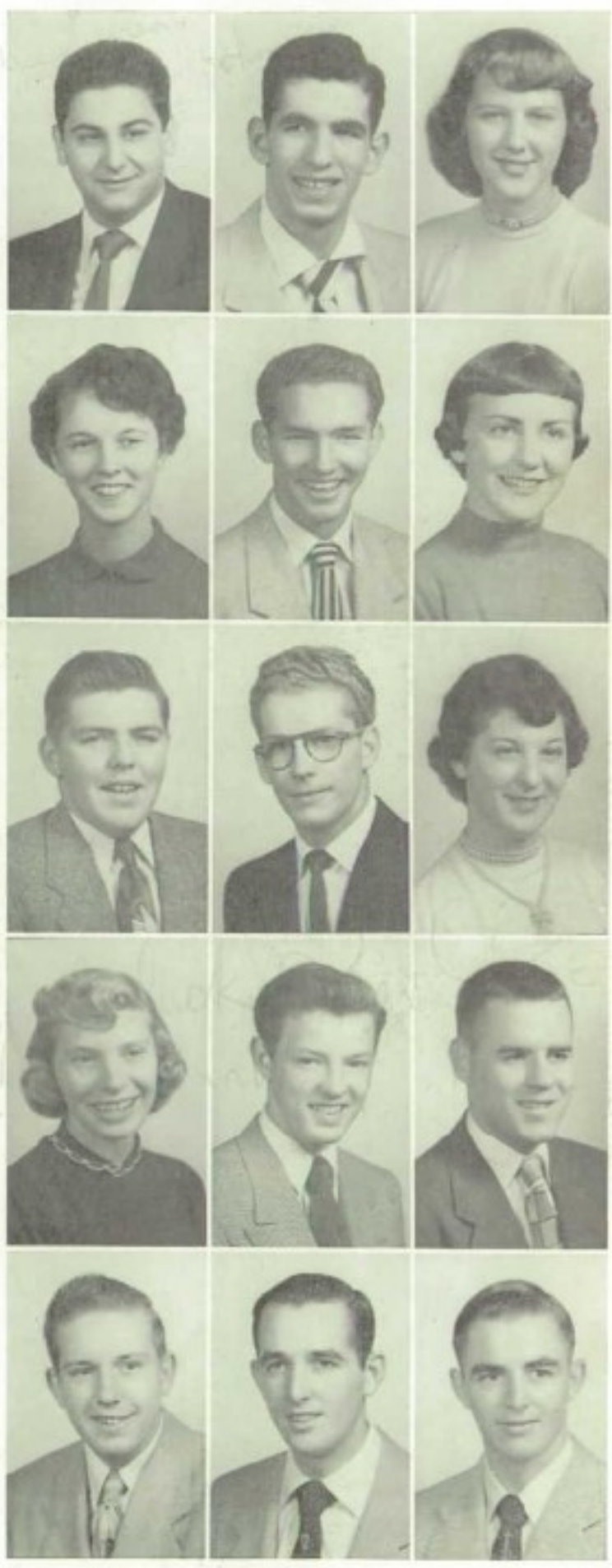

Ray is planning to work for a carpenter after graduation. Hunting, fishing, and roller skating take up his spare time.



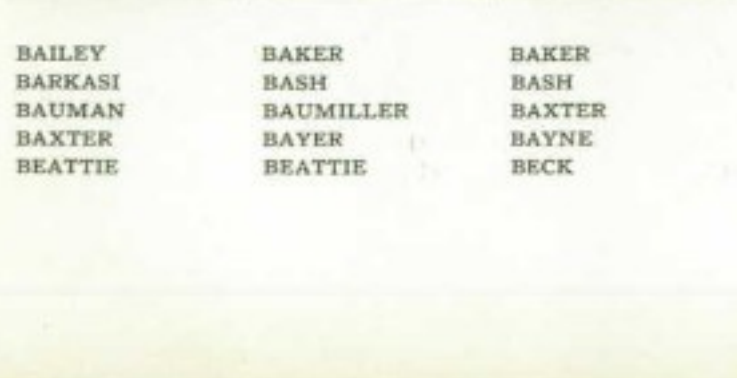
GERALD R. BARKASI
